

PICNIC AND GAMES MARK LABOR DAY

**There Will Be No Parade
This Year, But Other Fea-
tures Have Been Arranged
to Celebrate Day.**

Labor day will be observed today by organized labor with a picnic and games at Piedmont park, by the aquatic meet of the Athletic club at East Lake, and the cessation of many of the city's activities.

According to an order of Mayor Woodward, all public works of the city other than those absolutely necessary, will be suspended, and the city hall officially closed. Council may meet, however, for a short session.

Local labor will do away with the annual parade in observance of Labor day this year, and games and a picnic at Piedmont park are to be substituted. Park Commissioner Cochran has arranged for the band to play on this occasion. Prize lists have been arranged for the several features of the celebration, which are to include swimming, foot and wheelbarrow races, tugs-of-war, jumping contests and many other stunts.

The national banks will be closed in recognition of the holiday and the federal building also.

The nine events of the Atlanta Athletic club's championship contests are: 100-yard swim (free style) novices; 50-yard swim (free style) novices; 50-yard back-stroke swim; 100-yard swim, breast stroke; plunge for distance; under-water swimming; 440-yard swim (free style); obstacle canoe race and fancy diving.

The Fifth Regiment band will render the concert at Piedmont park this afternoon, which begins at 2 o'clock.
